

INFORMAL TRADERS

Council will procure goods, work and services of suppliers within the region who do not possess obligatory requirements outlined in Section 50, in accordance with Section 4 of the Public Procurement Act (Act No.15 of 2015).

Reservations for Informal Traders:

- The council will procure project materials for Rural Development Programmes from suppliers operating in Oshana Region.
- Procurement of food items including oxen and goats for celebration of National Events at Constituency Officers will be sourced from within the constituency.

In this regard, Council will seek prior exemptions each year in terms of Section 4 (2) of the Public Procurement Act (Act No.15 of 2015)

PROCUREMENT POLICY REGULATIONS TO SUPPORT MSME's & INFORMAL TRADERS

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OBJECTIVE

Oshana Regional Council has adopted a new procurement policy designed to promote economic empowerment within the region

The policy introduces new strategic measures to ensure equitable participation of Micro, Small, and Medium Enterprises (MSMEs), Youth-Owned Businesses, and Informal Traders in the Council's procurement processes

To promote fairness and prevent the monopolization of procurement opportunities, no contractor or supplier shall be awarded more than three contracts, each valued at N\$500,000, within the same financial year

MICRO, SMALL & MEDIUM ENTERPRISES

The council has reserved a minimum of 15% of its procurement opportunities for Micro, Small, and Medium Enterprises (MSMEs) in the Oshana Region.

Eligibility is subjected to the MSME's capacity to deliver goods, works and services up to a threshold of N\$15 000.

Requirements

- MSME's with an annual turnover of less than N\$300 000.
- Fitness certificate from the local authority or letter from the Constituency Office or Headman.

YOUTH-OWNED ENTERPRISES

This category is dedicated to supporting Youth-Owned Businesses. A minimum of 15% of the procurement opportunities for contracts valued below N\$50,000 are reserved for businesses owned by youth operating in the Oshana Region.

This initiative supports the Council's commitment to empower and create jobs for the youth.

Requirements

- Business must be 51% owned by the youth.
- Fitness certificate from the Local Authority or Letter from the Constituency Office or Headman
